Writing

Narratives	<i>Purpose: To tell stories in a sequence of events. These can be written for all purposes (entertain, inform, persuade)</i>
Possible writing opportunities:	Retells, innovates, diaries, monologues, descriptions
Persuasion – write to persuade	<i>Purpose: To make a case for a particular point of view and encourage the reader/listener towards the same way of seeing things.</i>
Possible writing opportunities:	Advertisements, compliant letter, magazine article, letter, debate, poster
Instructions – write to inform	<i>Purpose: To tell how to do something; to describe a task in chronological order</i>
Possible writing opportunities:	Instructions, recipes, science experiments, rules for behaviour, DT write up
Report – write to inform	<i>Purpose: To describe what things are/were like or to inform people about a particular subject</i>
Possible writing opportunities:	Information texts, speeches, leaflets
Recount – write to inform/entertain	<i>Purpose: To retell events in the order in which they happened</i>
Possible writing opportunities:	Recounting trips, diary entries, newspaper reports, historical accounts, retelling stories
Explanation – write to inform	<i>Purpose: to explain how or why, e.g. to explain the processes involved in a natural/social phenomena or to explain something is the way it is</i>
Possible writing opportunities:	Science investigation, speech, technical manuals, explaining the role of the River Nile in the seasons of Egypt.
